The meeting was called to order at 10:10 a.m. by 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President Sandi Tinyk, who thanked all for being there. Roll was called by the Secretary, and the minutes of the June meeting were read. The only correction was that RIFGC received the NER Award for the 2011 Flower Show that was chaired by Ann Huntoon. The correction has been made, and the minutes are filed as corrected.

- Announced that RIFGC received an award for the Most Beautiful Float in the Non-Commercial Category at the Bristol 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade
- Announced that we were asked to have a float in the Columbus Day Parade in Providence and that the invitation was declined.
- Reported that Education Day was quite successful.
- The New England Regional meeting and symposium will be held in Providence October 14-17.
- Another Habitat for Humanity house was planted bringing the total this year to three

Sandi Tinyk, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, reported:

- Thanked those who attended the Blue Star Memorial Marker dedication. She noted that the former Secretary of the Navy was the speaker, and NGC president Shirley Nikolai also attended.
