The theme is SPRING-in Living Color. She showed us props, described designs and mentioned a "bulb challenge' for presidents and imaginative Youth projects (a caterpillar and a mask). Ann Huntoon will be handling staging among other aspects of the show.

Habitat for Humanity will be planting in the Spring 2016 as the current house is just framed and not ready for landscaping. There is a Walkathon planned in June after our Board Meeting to raise funds for H for H so that we can afford mature plantings that are easier for new homeowners to care for. It was suggested that we start a Landscape Council to oversee the plantings at one year.

Linda Alves reports for **Horticulture** that Impatiens are still affected by downy mildew, but New Guinea Impatiens are fine. Turnips and kale are sweetened by delaying harvesting. She saw a few monarch butterflies this summer on her milkweed. The NGC has asked what our state butterfly is. Email Cathy with suggestions.
